

"Though I wanted to do a course in IT Admin, I was selected for AUTOCAD. Our trainer counselled me for the importance of this course. Despite having no prior knowledge, I am confident that I can move forward in this course, Ms. Muniba opines.

Ms. Muniba believes in the adage: "when the going gets tough, the tough get going". The life was comfortable for her with a family of six people. She was doing her BS in Commerce from Jinnah University, when her father who was a driver in a consumer product company, suddenly died. Muniba chose survival of the family over her own desire to get higher education. She left her BS incomplete and started a teaching job in a school, for mere Rs 4000 a month. Soon she got to know about the course at VTI Buffer Zone and eventually got herself enrolled.

All the courses, which are being delivered at various technical institutes of Karachi, are supported by a special training fund for Sindh and Balochistan, which has been set up by the TVET Sector Support Programme. The Programme is funded by the European Union and the governments of the Germany and Norway in order to prepare young people for the labour market.

The fund supports training institutes to develop and provide tailormade programmes for enterprises. The objective is to facilitate the training of 18, 000 men and women and assist them in finding employment after graduation.

"I think the course will help me in seeking better career in future," 25-year old Ms. Muniba implies while working on a 3-D Max Studio model project. Her OJT is part of fund's objective to encourage training institutes and enterprises to link theoretical with practical training at the workplace.

All the courses, which are being delivered supported by a special training fund set up by the TVET Sector Support Programme.

"The innovative training approach of this course has elevated my confidence".

Mr. Israr Adnan the owner of D 4 Design has high hopes with these girls. "I have dedicated a teacher to make them excel in the commercial demands of interior and exterior décor, which will help them find better opportunities in the commercial sector, says Mr. Israr."

All these girls, in their twenties, coming from various parts of Karachi, have different stories to tell. As the aerobic trainer-cum-herbalist Ms. Beena Asghar, who now wants to explore interior and exterior deigning through AUTOCAD course, puts it simply. "My father is jobless, but I was not able to contribute much to the family income, through earlier skills I acquired. The innovative training approach of this course has elevated my confidence, besides sharpening my communication skills. The competency-based skill model of these courses has developed our competency for the skill we have acquired. And I have a way to go," she says with a dint of smile on her beautiful face.

NAVTTC AND FPCCI ESTABLISH NATIONAL SKILLS FORUM

NAVTTC CONSTITUTES PRIVATE SECTOR ENGAGEMENT CELL

The National Vocational and Technical Training Commission (NAVTTC) has established a dedicated private sector engagement cell in order to streamline the collaboration with the private sector.

The cell headed by the Executive Director of NAVTTC consist of a director and four deputy directors. The cell is mandated to ensure proactive liaison with the private sector partners.

According to a notification issued on November 23rd, 2018, the will help in advancing the cause of skill enhancement of the youth and would pave way for the employability of the graduates of the technical and vocational education and training sector.

An active role of the private sector in planning, designing and delivery of technical and vocational education and training is a pre-requisite for producing skilled workforce according to the demands of the labour market.

The newly established cell would work for better coordination through the private sector engagement for access to quality skills training through various modes including on-the-job training.

NAVTTC, being an apex body of the TVET sector in the country has given prime importance to private sector, which is essential to build a demand-driven TVET system in Pakistan for increasing youth employability and industrial productivity.

NAVTTC has also established sector skill councils comprised of public and private sector representatives in the hospitality and construction sectors besides the establishment of employer-led Institute Management Committees with the support of the TVET Sector Support Programme, funded by the European Union and governments of Germany and Norway.

INDUSTRY TO CONTINUE SUPPORT TVET SECTOR REFORM

Representatives of leading business and industry associations from across Pakistan have resolved to continue supporting the technical and vocational education and training (TVET) sector reform in the country. The commitment was made in a workshop organized in Islamabad on November 28, 2018.

Employers and representatives of various associations and chambers of commerce and industry renewed their commitments at a workshop organized jointly by the National Vocational and Technical Training Commission (NAVTTC) and TVET Sector Support Programme, which is funded by the European Union and the governments of Germany and Norway.

Pakistan has embarked upon a phased wise reform programme within the TVET sector to improve its quality and relevance since 2011 with the support of international development partners. He mentioned that NAVTTC has recently established a National Skills Forum in collaboration with the FPCCI as well as industry-led Sector Skills Councils in various key economic sectors. He said without the active engagement of the private sector, the TVET design and delivery cannot be made relevant to the job market needs. He urged the industry to come forward and help NAVTTC in improving quality and relevance of the TVET system in Pakistan.



NAVTTC LAUNCHES SKILLS TRAINING FOR TEACHERS



The National Vocational and Technical Training Commission has launched a special skills training for the teachers from technical education and vocational training stream.

The technical skills upgradation training, which involves hands on practical learning, has been initiated with the support of TVET Sector Support Programme that is funded by the European Union and the governments of Germany and Norway.

TVET TERM CRITICAL FOR YOUTH IN BALOCHISTAN

He said this while addressing a certificate distribution ceremony, wherein as many as 130 pass outs of various Competency Based Training (CBT) courses were handed over the certificates.



"Our government wants to utilize this potential of socio-economic development to its fullest, which we understand cannot be materialized without reforming the TVET system in the country," the secretary opined.

At-present, approximately two-third of the Punjab's population is below the age of 30. This youth bulge, which is likely to carry on well beyond 2025, is resulting in a surge of young adults entering the job market, the secretary said. "We won't be able to convert this youth bulge into economic dividend without reforming and making a robust TVET system that caters for industry requirements locally and internationally," the secretary remarked.

Mr. Rehman said that the Government of the Punjab highly values the contributions of European Union, Germany, Norway, and other development partners to reform and uplift the system of Technical Education and vocational training.

While addressing to the occasion, Ms. Anne Marchal, Deputy Ambassador of the European Union said, "It is important to appreciate the current government's commitment to create 10 million job opportunities for the Pakistani youth and equip youth with technical skills through opting TVET policy. She said that this policy would not only produce highly skilled labour equipped with qualitative technical education but to boost the economy as-well". "Action speaks louder than words."

It was nothing short of a surprise for a stranger seeing young Maazaallah, a mute and deaf trainee at the Gems & Jewellery Training and Manufacturing Centre (GJTMC), Quetta, dealing with his customers in a very professional manner, with his sign language and advising them about a gemstone or a piece of jewellery.

His efforts, to speak a word or two in a muffled manner, showed his strong desire to speak his mind, but he was true personification of proverb "action speaks louder than words."

"He tried to get treatment from various places, but nothing worked," says Sanober Khan, his facilitator, cousin, friend and business partner.

The venue was "Gems and Jewellery Exhibition and Skill Showcasing", held at the backyard of Serena Hotel, Quetta, with the joint collaboration of Pakistan and Gems and Jewellery Development Company and Serena hotel.

His efforts, to speak a word or two in a muffled manner, showed his strong desire to speak his mind..

As many as 38 exhibitors from Quetta, Chagai, Kharan, Lahore, Rawalpindi, and Karachi and the students of GJTMC had sets up their stalls at the exhibition. The objective was to provide a platform to people associated with gems and jewelry business besides connecting the trainees of GJTMC with the market and the business community and showcase their skills and products. The exhibition showcased jewellery with precious stones like diamond and ruby and other decoration pieces studded with precious and semi-precious stones.

Maazallah had also set up a stall there, though he already has a shop at Abdus Sattar Road, Quetta, one of the commercial hubs of Quetta.

Engaged in gems cutting craft for the past eight years, the 22 years old gifted trainee is educated till 8th grade in a special school. "advanced knowledge and skills acquired from the GJTMC helped pertaining to jewels and gemstones helped me to run my shop very well.



We deal in precious gemstones coming from various districts of Balochistan, Afghanistan or Thailand like ruby, emerald, topaz, amethyst, Thermolene. It's an unpredictable business, where a single business deal can earn you Rs 100,000, or you keep waiting for a jewel lover for another six months," Maazallah said with the help of his interpreter.

GJTMC, Quetta, offers courses in gemstone faceting, gemstone carving, fashion jewellery making (beads and wires) and gemmology in teaching factory mode, which is more than just a pedagogic approach that benefits student learning alone. In this methodology, a real-world environment within a typical institutional setting is created. After initial training, the students undertake industry project work in which staff and students work closely as a team on real-life industry problems.

The centre has a total of 100 trainees, of which 25 are females. "Out of total 25 females, 24 are in fashion jewellery designing while one trainee is enrolled in gemmology class," says Bashir Agha, Pakistan Gems & Jewellery (MoIP, GoP), and Project Coordinator of the Training Fund Programme.

GJTMC, Quetta, a project of Pakistan Gems and Jewellery Development Company, Ministry of Industry and Production, Government of Pakistan, started offering courses under CBT (Competency Based Training) through a special training fund for Sindh and Balochistan, which was set up by the TVET Sector Support Programme, funded by the European Union and Germany and Norwegian governments. The fund prepares young people for the labour market. The fund supports training institutes to develop and provide tailor-made programmes for enterprises. The objective is to facilitate the training of 18,000 men and women in Sindh and Balochistan and assist them in finding employment after graduation.

"Balochistan is a land of gemstones, where precious gems found locally include Peridot, Ruby, Topaz, Quartz, Amethyst. These should be represented not only at national but international level as well, by giving proper training and skills to the unemployed youth. Designed while keeping in mind the market demand, the courses equip trainees with enough knowledge to either work in any enterprise or start their own business. A simple identification of a gemstone by an expert costs Rs. 200 while if they want a certification and report, then it is given for Rs. 1,000. If nothing, a trainee, especially a female trainee, can earn by identification of a gemstone from home," says Bashir Agha, who himself is in this business for a decade now.

According to Bashir Agha, so far, he has held 13 exhibitions in Balochistan and two internationally. Besides, he also participates in exhibitions in other cities of Pakistan to gain maximum knowledge and transfer the same to the students. Besides, he has developed business linkages and created opportunities for the students trained at his institute which benefits the overall industry engagement process, creating learning and employment opportunities for the trainees. The Gems and Jewellery exhibition is one such effort.

In this exhibition, the interest of visitors, specially tourists from other countries, had given new impetus to the youth of this largest province of Pakistan in terms of land area. The passion, dedication and an urge to move forward is there, all they need is a platform, like the one provided by TVET Sector Support Programme at GJTMC, where the trainees like Maazallah can learn and earn simultaneously.

Human capital, energy and agriculture and are some of Pakistan's potentials, which have not yet been sufficiently used due to lack of required skilled workforce. The current of the population of Pakistan is approximately 200 million out of which 48.76 percent are women. Nearly 17 percent of the youth complete secondary education and a very small percentage acquire employable skills. Majority of the young people drift off into the informal sector and learn various vocational skills through the traditional *Ustad-Shagird* system. Annually, 3 million young people enter the job market, but as of 2015, there are only 476,850 places available in the formal Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) through 3,581 institutes across Pakistan.



Apart from this mismatch between demand and supply, even quality and relevance of the training delivered is not according to the demands of the job market. To improve access, quality, equity and relevance of TVET, the Government of Pakistan embarked upon a comprehensive reform in 2011 with the support of the European Union and the governments of Germany, the Netherlands and Norway. The first phase of the reform, which is based on the National Skills Strategy (NSS), has ended in December 2016. During this period a number of milestones were achieved such as national TVET Policy, National Vocational Qualifications Framework (NVQF) and the introduction of Competency Based Training & Assessment (CBT&A) etc.

The second phase of the TVET Sector Support Programme has been launched in January 2017 for another five years. The Programme is supported by the European Union, the Federal Republic of Germany and the Royal Norwegian Embassy. The overall objective of the Programme is to improve governance and private sector participation in the TVET sector to increase quality skill development that meets the demand of the labour market.
